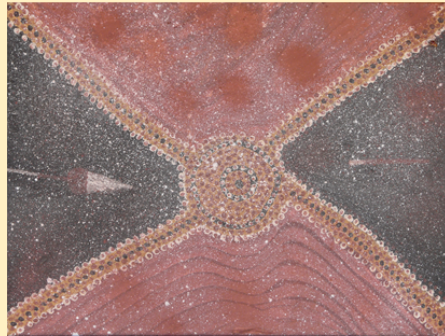

ABOUT US

The work of the Mirima Dawang Woortlab-gerring Language and Culture Centre (MDWg) began more than 30 years ago when Elders realised the Miriwoong language was under threat of extinction. Since then, MDWg has worked to preserve and revitalise the critically endangered Miriwoong language to ensure it continues to be spoken for generations to come.

MDWg delivers a range of innovative programs to achieve this goal. The Miriwoong Language Nest program teaches the Miriwoong language to more than 400 children a week throughout Kununurra.

MDWg also publishes books and records radio programs in language as well as hosting language classes and cultural awareness training for the public.

MDWg is now looking to engage with local businesses to make the Miriwoong language more visible in spaces throughout Kununurra.



MODERN MIRIWOONG

MDWg's Modern Miriwoong project offers language consultation and signage translation services by Miriwoong Elders, senior speakers and linguists to local businesses and organisations.

The project was developed in response to local demand for increased visibility of the traditional language of the region and will enable Miriwoong signage to be developed in spaces throughout Miriwoong country.

This will enable Miriwoong people to reconnect with their language while highlighting the cultural richness of the region to visitors in a meaningful way.

MDWg is proud to offer language consultation services to the Kununurra community and is eager to work with local businesses to make the Miriwoong language more visible and accessible throughout the region.

This project will continue to create meaningful employment for Miriwoong people while fostering further positive engagement between the Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities of Kununurra.
